 <p style="text-align: center;"> Past Present Future </p>	<p>Use:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ An action, plan, intention at some point in a future time. ✓ To predict future events.
<p style="text-align: center;">Will + verb in the infinitive (NO subject change)</p> <p>Affirmative: SUBJECT + WILL + ORIGINAL VERB FORM + object, etc.</p> <p>I, we, you, they, he, she, it + WILL + play + football tomorrow.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Verb to be (AM, ARE, IS) + GOING TO + verb in the infinitive</p> <p>Affirmative: SUBJECT + VERB TO BE + GOING TO + ORIGINAL VERB FORM + object, etc.</p> <p>I + am + GOING TO + play + football tomorrow. He + is + GOING TO + play + football tomorrow. They + are + GOING TO + play football tomorrow.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Intention, plan, but it is not 100% certain that it will happen. ✓ Offer to help someone. ✓ Decision made at the time of speaking; often a promise to do something. ✓ Prediction – an opinion about something. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ A definite plan. ✓ A clear intention with almost 100% certainty that it will happen. ✓ Prediction - evidence / facts or you are an expert on the subject.
<p>Negative: SUBJECT + WON'T + ORIGINAL FORM OF THE VERB + (object + place + time)</p> <p>I, we, you, they, he, she, it + won't play + football tomorrow.</p>	<p>Negative: SUBJECT + TO BE (NEGATIVE FORM) + GOING TO + VERB IN THE ORIGINAL FORM + (object + place + time):</p> <p>I + am not + going to play + football tomorrow. He + isn't + going to play + football tomorrow.</p>
<p>Interrogative : Choose either form : SHORT</p> <p>a. WILL + SUBJECT + ORIGINAL VERB FORM + OPT? WILL + I, we, you, they, he, she, it + play + football tomorrow?</p> <p>b. TO BE + SUBJECT + GOING TO + ORIGINAL VERB FORM + OPT? ARE + you + going to + play + football tomorrow?</p>	<p>Interrogative : Choose either form : LONG</p> <p>a. W/H + WILL + SUBJECT + ORIGINAL VERB FORM + OPT? What + will + you + do + tomorrow?</p> <p>b. W/H + TO BE + SUBJECT + GOING TO + ORIGINAL VERB FORM + OPT? What are + you + going to + do tomorrow</p>
<p>Other:</p> <p>Fixed, regular, timetabled events you can also use the present simple: <i>The train for Talca leaves tomorrow at 6.</i> Definite events you can also use the present continuous: <i>I am leaving for New York at 8 on Wednesday night.</i> General intentions you can also use, "I intend..."; "I plan to..."; "I would like..."; "I want...".</p>
