Go - Went - Gone

This verb can be a little bit confusing as you use different forms depending on where you are going to! These are called noun collocations where the verb 'to go' is with certain nouns.

Unfortunately, there are no fixed rules with collocations it can take a lot of practice to become familiar with how they are used. There is often no reason why words collate, some words are just often put together. The problem with collocations is that the meaning cannot be guessed from looking at part of it.
