## **Hope and Wish**

These words are important for expressing what you want, and how probable it is to happen.

## hope

If I <u>hope</u> for something, I want it to happen, but I am not sure that it will, and I can do nothing about it.

I hope she messages me soon.

I hope they find the cure for COVID-19 soon.

hope for + object I'm <u>hoping</u> for <u>a text</u> from Rosy.

hope + infinitive I hope to still be here next year. It's so beautiful

hope + that-clause I hope that they get here soon.

hope so Will they mark Women's Day? I hope so.

## wish

<u>Wish</u> (usually,) is wanting something that will **probably** not happen or being sorry that things are not different.

I wish I could fly.
I wish I had more money.

I wish she would stop singing.

subject + wish + clause: subject + past tense I wish I was richer. (were, if formal)

I wish I **spoke** Russian.

subject + wish +.clause: subject + past perfect I wish I had gone on the trip.

I wish I hadn't said that.
