## Long hours Culture

Japanese workers work longer hours than workers in many other countries around the world. A typical employee in a Japanese company works around 9 hours every day, compared with about 8 hours in the US and 7 in many European Union countries.

What do Japanese workers do?
How many hours do they work compared to workers in the US and Europe?
Japanese workers get about 20 days' holiday each year but a typical employee only uses about 9 days of holiday, which is less than $50 \%$. Workers in other Far Eastern countries use all or almost all of their holiday. So, Japanese workers work longer hours and take less holiday than employees in many other countries in the Far East region. There is even a word in the Japanese language - karoshi - which means working so hard that you kill yourself.

Is this the same in other Far Eastern countries?
What is the Japanese word for someone who works so hard that they kill themselves?
But now, the Japanese government is asking companies to let their employees leave work at 3 pm on the last Friday of every month. The government hopes that employees will use the extra free time to spend money in shops and restaurants and help the economy.

What does the Japanese government want companies to do?

Why do they want them to do this?
Some big Japanese companies like the government's new idea and say that their employees can leave work at 3pm on one Friday each month if they want to. However, almost half of Japanese companies say they do not have any plans to change their working hours.

Many Japanese workers, especially new employees, often go home late from work, even when they have nothing to do. This is because it is a tradition in Japan for junior employees never to leave work before their boss. Working long hours is also a sign that you are a good worker and that you are loyal to your company.

Apart from this tradition, what is another reason that workers work such long hours?
