Rules No. 10, 11 and 12 - Places

Rule No. 10 is for names of places for '*republics'*, 'states' and kingdoms. For example, the Czech Republic, the United Kingdom.

Rule No. 11 is for most *hotels, museums, theatres and cinema*. For example, the Ritz Hotel in London or cinemas such as the Odeon.

The final rule here, Rule No. 12, is with the word 'of' for certain places. So, for example, we'd say the Tower of London or the Great Wall of China.
