She / her

They are both pronouns.

<u>She</u> = subject form of a personal pronoun

<u>Her</u> = object form. Can also be a possessive adjective depending on how you are using it. These words change the noun following it in order to show possession.

So, we'd say:

<u>She</u> is very pretty. (= personal pronoun) They visited <u>her</u> when they went to NY. (=object pronoun) <u>Her</u> hair is very pretty. (= possessive adjective)
