	<p><u>Antonyms:</u> Discourage, Dissuade, Keep mum, Keep quiet</p>
2. Generous	<p><u>Synonyms:</u> Benevolent, Charitable, Considerate, Hospitable, Unselfish, Willing Altruistic, Beneficent, Bounteous, Kind-hearted, Magnanimous, Munificent, Philanthropic, Profuse</p>
	<p><u>Antonyms:</u> Mean, Greedy, Inattentive, Inconsiderate, Malevolent, Selfish, Thoughtless</p>
3. Genius	<p><u>Synonym:</u> Smart, Accomplished, Brilliant, Flair, Inspired, Intelligent, Inventive, Original, Prodigy, Talented, Adept, Astute, Brainy, Capable, Expert, Virtuoso</p>

Positive	<p><u>Synonym:</u> Definite, decisive, affirmative, concrete, firm, actual, assured, categorical, clear-cut, convinced, decided, direct, explicit, factual, forceful, inarguable, incontestable, indisputable, irrefutable, outright, sure, unambiguous, undeniable, unequivocal, unmistakable</p>
	<p><u>Antonym:</u> Negative, uncertain, vague, imprecise</p>
6. Provide	<p><u>Synonym:</u> Cater, bring, contribute, furnish, give, grant, hand over, lend, present, produce, accommodate, bestow, dispense, feed, impart, outfit, proffer, render, replenish, sustain, fix up, look after, stock up, take care of</p>
