

## Take and Bring

These two verbs can be a bit difficult to understand.

**Bring** = we ask people to bring things to the place where we are. Bring is used in relation to a destination:

- "Bring some wine to the party."
- "Bring your homework to me"
- "Please bring your bag here."

**Take** = we take things to the place we are going to. We take them from the place where we are to another place. Take is used in relation to a starting point:

- "I'm going to take some cake to Rosy's house for his birthday party."
- "Take your dog away from me."
- "Please take your bag there."
