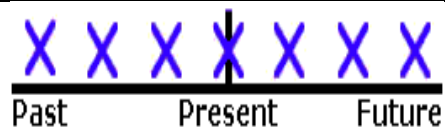


PRESENT SIMPLE – EVERY VERB (APART FROM THE VERB ‘TO BE’) – Auxiliary – **DO**



Use:

- ✓ Routines
- ✓ Habits
- ✓ Facts
- ✓ To express fixed arrangements in the future
- ✓ How often we do something (always, never, once a year, etc.,)

Verbs – FIRST & SECOND PERSON (I, we, you, they)

Original form

TO PLAY
TO WALK
TO STUDY

Affirmative: **SUBJECT** + **ORIGINAL FORM** + object, etc.

I, we, you, they + **play** + football.

Verbs - THIRD PERSON + 's' (He, she, it) **E.g.:**

TO CRY (Ending in consonant + y) = cries
TO PASS (Verbs ending in s, -z, -ch, -sh, or -x add " es") = passes
TO GO (Verbs ending in o) = goes
TO HAVE (Word change) = has

Affirmative: **SUBJECT** + **3rd PERSON FORM** + object, etc.

He, she, it + **plays** + football.

Negative: **SUBJECT** + **DO NOT / DOES NOT** + **ORIGINAL FORM OF THE VERB** + (object / place / time)

REGULAR VERBS: I, we, you, they + **don't** + play + football.

THIRD PERSON: He, she, it + **doesn't** + play + football.

Interrogative:

a. Yes / No questions: **DO / DOES** + **SUBJECT** + **ORIGINAL FORM OF THE VERB** + (object / place / time) ?

Do I, we, you, they + **play** + football? Yes, I do. / No, I don't.

Does, he, she, it + **play** + football? Yes, he does. / No, he doesn't

b. W/H questions: **W/H QUESTION WORD** + **AUX** + **SUBJECT** + **ORIGINAL FORM OF THE VERB** + (object / place / time)?

What do I, we, you, they + **like** + to do at the weekend? I like to play football.

Where does he, she, it + **play** + football? He **plays** football at the stadium.
