Parts of Speech



These are the basic types of words that the English language has. These are basically the job a word has in a sentence:

<u>Noun</u> - a naming word for a person, place, thing, idea, living creature, quality, or action. Examples: *cowboy*, *theatre, box, thought, tree, kindness, arrival.*

<u>Conjunction</u> - joins two words, phrases or sentences together. Examples: *but, so, and, because, or.*

<u>Pronoun</u> - used instead of a noun, to avoid repeating the noun. Examples: *I, you, he, she, it, we, they.*

<u>**Preposition</u>** - usually comes before a noun, pronoun or noun phrase. It joins the noun to some other part of the sentence. Examples: on, in, by, with, under, through, at.</u> <u>Verb</u> - an action word for doing something or a state of being something. Examples: *walk, talk, think, believe, live, like, want.*

<u>Adjective</u> - a word that describes a thing. It tells you something about it. Examples: *big, yellow, thin, amazing, beautiful, quick, important.*

<u>Adverb</u> - a word which usually describes a verb. It tells you how something is done or when or where something happened. Examples: *slowly, intelligently, well, yesterday, tomorrow, here, everywhere.*

<u>Interjection</u> - an unusual kind of word, as it often stands alone. They are words which express emotion or surprise. Examples: Ouch!, Hello!, Hurray!, Oh no!, Ha!

The 8 parts of speech don't include Articles, but these words which are used to introduce nouns are also important. Examples: *the, a, an*
